WHEREAS the Environmental Protection Agency has also granted New York City an extension for one particularly expensive reservoir replacement project; and

WHEREAS, based on this information, the Passaic County Planning Department would like to see the Passaic Valley Water Commission delay movement on the construction until the updated rules are released and less harmful solutions are explored; and

WHEREAS, these three sites about residential neighborhoods and the introduction of tanks would render them industrial in look while also raising the residents' water rates; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Wood-Ridge are desirous of demonstrating their support for the delay on the project, until the updated rules are released; and

WHEREAS, the State of New Jersey has experienced a series of extreme weather events over the last two years, including but not limited to: Hurricane Irene, the October 2011 snowstorm, Superstorm Sandy and an accompanying Nor'easter; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Wood-Ridge was impacted by said extreme weather events, including but not limited to: flooding, outages, and fallen trees; and

WHEREAS, Public Service Electric and Gas Company (PSE&G) provides the Borough of Wood-Ridge electric and gas service; and

WHEREAS, said extreme weather events severely damaged PSE&G infrastructure, including but not limited to: flooded electrical substations due to storm surges, downed power lines and poles due to high winds and fallen trees, and the destruction of gas meters due to contact with water; and

WHEREAS, said damages to PSE &G infrastructure contributed to the Borough of Wood-Ridge's said impacts; and

WHEREAS, the New Jersey Board of Public Utilities (BPU) issued an order on January 23, 2013 directing the State's electric and gas utilities, including PSE&G to implement certain recommendations in the areas of "Preparedness efforts", "Communications", "Restoration and response", "Post event", and "Underlying infrastructure issues"; and

WHEREAS, PSE&G submitted an infrastructure filing on February 20, 2013 entitled "Energy Strong"; and

WHEREAS, "Energy Strong" proposes an investment of \$3.9B worth of infrastructure projects over a 10 year period to enhance PSE&G's electrical and gas system, including but not limited to fortifying electrical stations, replacing and modernizing cast iron gas mains, deploying smart grid technologies, improving pole distribution systems, creating more redundancies, undergrounding of electricity lines, and protecting gas metering stations; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Wood-Ridge would benefit from the proposed investments in the "Energy Strong" filing.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Wood-Ridge formally declares its support for PSE&G's "Energy Strong" program.

PSE&G’s Energy Strong program calls for \$3.9 billion in investments over 10 years to harden utility infrastructure and guard against increasingly extreme weather. The utility proposes spending \$2.6 billion in the first five years, with a potential investment of another \$1.3 billion in the following five years.

The improvements will have far-reaching, long-lasting benefit to New Jersey, supporting the state’s economy by creating 5,800 jobs – all without asking customers to pay more.

PSE&G’s plan includes protecting utility installations from storm surges, strengthening distribution lines, making the electric grid smarter and thereby easier to fix, and modernizing the gas distribution system.

Key provisions:

- \$1.7 billion to raise, relocate or protect 31 electric switching and substations affected by recent storms as well as those in newly designated flood zones.
- \$1.04 billion to replace and modernize 750 miles of low-pressure cast iron gas mains in or near flood areas.
- \$454 million for smart grid technologies that will add intelligence to the system and increase the utility’s ability to detect problems and make fixes.
- \$215 million to improve pole distribution systems.
- \$200 million to create additional redundancy in the system, reducing both amount and the time of outages.
- \$60 million to bury 20 miles of overhead electric distribution lines in areas that could see the biggest benefit
- \$140 million to protect 9 natural gas metering stations and a liquefied natural gas station affected by Sandy or located in flood zones

In addition to addressing concerns surrounding substations and switching stations, PSE&G’s proposal includes plans to move some wires and poles from backyards to streets in a number of towns, to team with one or more municipalities to pilot a program focused on reducing power problems associated with trees (trimming, managing vegetation, doing purposeful plantings so that trees are put in the right place and not likely to encroach on power lines) and to strengthen utility poles by testing different materials in various locations.

Why this program?

PSE&G frequently wins accolades for being the most reliable electric utility in the nation, and it has won regional reliability awards every year for more than a decade. But keeping the lights on day-to-day is no longer enough. Future investments must be about increasing resiliency, which is the ability to withstand damage and quickly recover from extreme weather and events.

Why now?

Extreme weather is becoming more common. PSE&G has endured three of the most dramatic events in its 100+ year history in the last two years. Hurricane Irene, the freak snowstorm in October 2011 and Superstorm Sandy



showed how susceptible our infrastructure is to extreme weather and how energy dependent we've become. Lengthy power outages can have a stunning impact on our way of life.

Together with the urgent need, we have:

- Cheap natural gas. The availability of low cost gas means that bills for PSE&G's residential gas customers are down 40% since 2008;
- Low interest rates; and
- A glut of available labor

This is an excellent time to invest in infrastructure.

At what cost?

Expenses associated with market restructuring will be coming off of PSE&G bills in 2014 and 2016, covering the costs of the Energy Strong program. PSE&G doesn't expect an impact on customer bills.

And, the cost of inaction is too high.

Sandy taught us how dependent we are on energy, and in turn, on gasoline. When water from the Newark Bay inundated parts of Middlesex County, refineries were amongst the hardest hit. A storm surge flooded a third of the Bayway Refinery in Linden, the largest refinery on the East Coast, providing roughly half of the gasoline used in New Jersey. The water corroded electrical systems, damaged pumps and compressors and destroyed buildings. And while the damage to the refinery caused days of power outages, it was the extensive damage to PSE&G's Sewaren switching station that kept the refinery offline, fueling gasoline shortages. PSE&G's Energy Strong plan calls for immediate changes to its switching station in Sewaren so that it can better withstand severe weather and serve the refineries that power New Jersey.

Who benefits?

Everyone. Widespread service interruptions affect all of the state's residents. Our lives- both at home and at work- depend on electricity. Recent storms illustrated the impact: shuttering gas stations, grocery stores, schools, airports and other facilities essential to everyday life. And power outages disproportionately impact those who can least afford it: seniors, low income households and small business owners. These people in particular have little ability to shoulder extensive disruptions or bear the costs associated with riding out a storm.

Extensive outages damage the economy, inflicting costs and losses that can never be recovered. The American Society of Civil Engineers warns that the failure to make adequate infrastructure investments in the electric sector could have significant impact on business productivity, employment and competitiveness.

PSE&G's Energy Strong proposal will reduce the impact and speed up the recovery process.

Where will the work be, and what kind of jobs will be created?

PSE&G's proposal calls for upgrades statewide, with significant work on electric and gas facilities in Bergen, Burlington, Camden, Essex, Hudson, Mercer, Middlesex, Passaic, Somerset and Union counties. The investments will employ thousands of people with engineering, design and construction work, and will create significant residual economic benefit along the supply chain.

WHEREAS, the Wood-Ridge Board of Education will utilize the subject premises primarily as an intermediate school for 4th, 5th, and 6th grades; and

WHEREAS, the parties wish to enter into a lease agreement and which said agreement is incorporated by reference in this ordinance and same is on file for public inspection in the office of the Wood-Ridge Borough Clerk; and

WHEREAS, the subject premises will be jointly utilized by the Board and the Borough and with respect thereto same shall be utilized in accordance with the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:12-14,15.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED AND ENACTED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Wood-Ridge, County of Bergen, State of New Jersey, as follows:

1. The Mayor, Clerk and/or Borough Attorney are hereby authorized to execute any and all documents necessary to effectuate the aforementioned Lease Agreement with the Wood-Ridge Board of Education. The said lease agreement is incorporated herein by reference and same shall be kept on file and available for inspection during normal business hours in the office of the Wood-Ridge Borough Clerk.

2. The Lease conveyance of land herein authorized is subject to the following terms and conditions:

i. All those provisions set forth in the hereinabove reference Lease Agreement authorized by this ordinance.

ii. The Lease Agreement as noted hereinabove shall be on file with the Borough Clerk and available for public inspection during normal business hours.

iii. The consideration for the subject Lease shall be the nominal sum of One Dollar (\$1.00) per year plus any and all other good and valuable consideration.

iv. The name of the public entity which shall be the Lessee will be the Wood-Ridge Board of Education.

v. The term of the Lease Agreement shall be fifty (50) years with a twenty-five (25) year extension with a commencement date of July 1, 2013 and a termination date of June 30, 2063. In no case shall such Lease term exceed the mandated number of years set forth in N.J.S.A. 40A:12-15.

vi. The subject Lease Agreement and this Ordinance shall be deemed to be in accord with N.J.S.A. 40A:12-14 and N.J.S.A. 40A:12-15 and any matters at variance with such Statutes shall be modified so that the within authorization and succeeding documents are in compliance with the dictates of such laws.

3. All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances inconsistent herewith are repealed as to such inconsistencies.

4. If any section, subsection, paragraph, sentence, clause or word of this Ordinance shall be adjudged invalid by a Court of competent jurisdiction, then such invalidity shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Ordinance.

5. This Ordinance shall become effective immediately upon adoption and publication according to law.

BOND ORDINANCE NO. 2013-17

A BOND ORDINANCE AMENDING BOND ORDINANCE 2011-14 OF THE BOROUGH OF WOOD-RIDGE, NEW JERSEY FINALLY ADOPTED OCTOBER 25, 2011, TO AMEND THE PROJECT DESCRIPTION, AND PROVIDING AN ADDITIONAL APPROPRIATION IN THE AMOUNT OF \$10,500,000, AND AUTHORIZING THE ADDITIONAL ISSUANCE OF \$10,500,000 OF BONDS AND NOTES TO FINANCE THE COST THEREOF ALL IN FURTHERANCE OF THE REDEVELOPMENT PLAN FOR THE WEST SIDE WOOD-RIDGE REDEVELOPMENT DISTRICT

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Wood-Ridge in the County of Bergen, New Jersey (the "**Borough**") by Resolution No. 98-2001 designated certain parcels of real property as an area in need of redevelopment pursuant to *N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-1 et seq.* (the "**Redevelopment Law**"); and,

WHEREAS, by Ordinance No. 2003-6 the Mayor and Council of the Borough adopted and approved the "West Side Wood-Ridge Redevelopment District" of the Borough (the "**District**") as more particularly set forth in that certain Redevelopment Plan dated June 16, 2003, as later amended by the "Westmont Station Redevelopment Plan" dated June 16, 2012 (the "**Redevelopment Plan**"), and which Ordinance designated the Mayor and Council of the Borough as the redevelopment entity for such Redevelopment Plan; and,

WHEREAS, to offset the projected impacts of the improvements to be undertaken pursuant to the Redevelopment Plan on the Borough's school system, the Borough determined that it would be in the best interests of the Borough residents to provide for the construction or acquisition of a mixed use facility to serve as a new grade school; and,

WHEREAS, the Borough serves as the "redevelopment entity," as defined in the Redevelopment Law, for the redevelopment of the District; and,

WHEREAS, the Borough has identified the former Assumption School, located at 151 First Street and known as Block 268, Lot 1 (the "**Property**") as an alternate facility which, in the judgment of the Mayor and Council, after consultation with the Board of Education of the Borough, is better suited as a new grade school due to its location, property condition and size; and,

WHEREAS, the Borough has investigated the Property and determined that it could be renovated in a cost efficient manner and is therefore a better value than constructing a new facility within the District; and,

WHEREAS, the Borough has further determined that the Property can also serve as a facility to service the Borough's community meeting space and recreational needs; and,

WHEREAS, on October 25, 2011, the Borough finally adopted a bond ordinance, entitled, “A Bond Ordinance of the Borough of Wood-Ridge, New Jersey Authorizing and Appropriating Not to Exceed \$7,000,000 to Acquire Certain Property Within the Borough to Service Certain Community, Recreational and Educational Needs of Borough Residents and Furthering Certain Provisions of the Redevelopment Plan for the West Side Wood-Ridge Redevelopment District” (the “**Original Bond Ordinance**”); and,

WHEREAS, the Original Bond Ordinance authorized the funding of (a) the acquisition of the Property “as is” for an amount not to exceed \$2,800,000 and (b) the renovation thereof including the renovation or repair of the roof, electric, plumbing, HVAC, and windows, asbestos floor removal and replacement, ADA compliance improvements and such other renovations, repairs or improvements to the facility and the Property as may be required to permit such facility and Property to serve the educational, community and recreational needs of the Redevelopment Project in particular and the community at large (collectively, the “**Initial Project**”); and,

WHEREAS, the Borough has entered into an Amended and Restated Redevelopment Agreement with Wood-Ridge Development, L.L.C. (the “**Redeveloper**”) dated as of March 1, 2013 (the “**Redevelopment Agreement**”), providing for the construction of various improvements under the Redevelopment Plan, including the construction of a train station and platform by the Redeveloper for service by the New Jersey Transit Corporation (the “**Train Station**”); and,

WHEREAS, the Redevelopment Area Bond Financing Law, *N.J.S.A. 40A:12-64 et seq.* (the “**RAB Law**”) provides that the Borough may issue bonds for the purpose of financing or refinancing a redevelopment project which is located within its jurisdiction; and,

WHEREAS, the Redevelopment Agreement provides for the issuance of bonds under the RAB Law (the “**Bonds**”) for the purpose of financing the improvements to the Property and the construction of the Train Station; and,

WHEREAS, the Borough desires and believes it is in the best interests of the Borough residents to exercise its authority under the RAB Law to authorize the issuance of the Bonds for purposes of acquiring financing the improvements to the Property and the construction of the Train Station; and,

WHEREAS, as a result, the Borough desires to amend the Original Bond Ordinance to include the construction of the Train Station (together with the Initial Project, the “**Project**”), provide an additional appropriation of \$10,500,000 for the Project and authorize the additional issuance of not to exceed \$10,500,000 of bonds and notes to finance the remaining costs of the Project; and,

NOW THEREFORE, be it ordained by the Mayor and Borough Council of the Borough of Wood-Ridge (not less than two-thirds of all members thereof affirmatively concurring), **AS FOLLOWS**:

Section 1. Section 3 of the Original Bond Ordinance is hereby amended in its entirety to read as follows:

The purpose of this bond ordinance is the funding of (a) the acquisition of the Property "as is" for an amount not to exceed \$2,800,000, (b) the renovation thereof, including the renovation or repair of the roof, electric, plumbing, HVAC, and windows, asbestos floor removal and replacement, ADA compliance improvements and such other renovations, repairs or improvements to the facility and the Property as may be required to permit such facility and Property to serve the educational, community and recreational needs of the Redevelopment Project in particular and the community at large and (c) the construction of the Train Station, and all related facilities and improvements. The project described in this Section 3 is a part of the Redevelopment Project and is located within the Redevelopment Area. The Mayor and Borough Clerk are all hereby authorized to execute a contract for such Property and their signatures shall authorize and bind the Borough with respect thereto.

Section 2. The improvements described in Section 4 of this bond ordinance, are hereby authorized to be undertaken by the Borough as general improvements. For the several improvements or purposes described herein, there is hereby appropriated the sum of \$10,500,000. Pursuant to the Section 37(c) of the Redevelopment Law, no down payment is required, notwithstanding the requirements of Section 11 of the Local Bond Law, *N.J.S.A. 40A:2-1 et seq.* (the "**Local Bond Law**").

Section 3. (a) In order to finance the cost of the improvements or purposes described herein, negotiable Bonds are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the Redevelopment Law in the principal amount of \$10,500,000. In anticipation of the issuance of the Bonds, negotiable bond anticipation notes are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to and within the limitations prescribed by the Redevelopment Law.

(b) The estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes to be issued for the improvements or purposes described herein is \$17,500,000, including the \$7,000,000 bonds or notes authorized by the Original Bond Ordinance and the \$10,500,000 bonds or notes authorized herein.

(c) The estimated cost of the improvements or purposes described herein is \$17,500,000, including the \$7,000,000 appropriated by the Original Bond Ordinance and the \$10,500,000 appropriated herein

Section 4. The purpose of this bond ordinance is the funding of (a) the acquisition of the Property "as is" for an amount not to exceed \$2,800,000, (b) the renovation thereof, including the renovation or repair of the roof, electric, plumbing, HVAC, and windows, asbestos floor removal and replacement, ADA compliance improvements and such other renovations, repairs or improvements to the facility and the Property as may be required to permit such facility and Property to serve the educational, community and recreational needs of the Redevelopment Project in particular and the community at large and (c) the construction of the Train Station, and all related facilities and improvements. The Project described in this Section 3 is a part of the Redevelopment Project and will help effectuate the redevelopment of the Redevelopment Area. The Mayor and Borough Clerk are all hereby authorized to execute a

contract for such Property and their signatures shall authorize and bind the Borough with respect thereto.

Section 5. All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder shall mature at such times as may be determined by the chief financial officer; provided that no note shall mature later than one year from its date. The bond anticipation notes shall bear interest at such rate or rates and be in such form as may be determined by the chief financial officer. The chief financial officer shall determine all matters in connection with bond anticipation notes issued pursuant to this bond ordinance, and the chief financial officer's signature upon the bond anticipation notes shall be conclusive evidence as to all such determinations. All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder may be renewed from time to time subject to the provisions of the Local Bond Law. The chief financial officer is hereby authorized to sell part or all of the bond anticipation notes from time to time, at not less than par and accrued interest, at public or private sale and to deliver them to the purchasers thereof upon receipt of payment of the purchase price plus accrued interest from their dates to the date of delivery thereof. The chief financial officer is directed to report in writing to the governing body at the meeting next succeeding the date when any sale or delivery of the bond anticipation notes pursuant to this bond ordinance is made. Such report must include the amount, the description, the interest rate and the maturity schedule of the bond anticipation notes sold, the price obtained and the name of the purchaser.

Section 6. The Borough hereby certifies that it has adopted a capital budget or a temporary capital budget, as applicable. The capital or temporary capital budget of the Borough is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this bond ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith. To the extent that the improvements or purposes authorized herein are inconsistent with the adopted capital or temporary capital budget, a revised capital or temporary capital budget has been filed with the Division of Local Government Services.

Section 7. The following additional matters are hereby determined, declared, recited and stated:

(a) The improvements or purposes described in Section 4 of this bond ordinance are not current expenses. They are improvements or purposes that the Borough lawfully may undertake as general improvements, and no part of the cost thereof has been or shall be specially assessed on property specially benefited thereby.

(b) Pursuant to *N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-37(c)*, the obligations authorized herein shall mature in annual installments commencing not more than two and ending not more than forty years from their date of issuance.

(c) The Supplemental Debt Statement required by the Local Bond Law has been duly prepared and filed in the office of the Clerk, and a complete executed duplicate thereof has been filed in the office of the Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs of the State of New Jersey. Such statement shows that the gross debt of the Borough as defined in the Local Bond Law is increased by the authorization of the Bonds and notes provided in this bond ordinance by \$10,500,000. Pursuant to Section 37(c) of the Redevelopment Law, the debt limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law do not apply to the obligations authorized herein.

(d) An aggregate amount of not exceeding \$5,000,000 for items of expense listed in and permitted under *N.J.S.A.* 40A:2-20 is included in the estimated cost indicated herein for the purposes or improvements. Of this amount, \$2,500,000 was estimated for these items of expense in the Original Bond Ordinance and an additional \$2,500,000 is estimated herein.

(e) The maximum rate of interest the Bonds or bond anticipation notes shall bear is seven percent (7.00%).

Section 8. The Borough hereby declares the intent of the Borough to issue the Bonds or bond anticipation notes in the amount authorized in Section 3 of this bond ordinance and to use proceeds to pay or reimburse expenditures for the costs of the purposes described in Section 4 of this bond ordinance. This Section 8 is a declaration of intent within the meaning and for purposes of Treasury Regulations §1.150-2 or any successor provisions of federal income tax law.

Section 9. Any grant moneys received for the purpose described in Section 4 hereof shall be applied either to direct payment of the cost of the improvement or to payment of the obligations issued pursuant to this bond ordinance. The amount of obligations authorized but not issued hereunder shall be reduced to the extent that such funds are so used.

Section 10. The full faith and credit of the Borough are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and the interest on the obligations authorized by this bond ordinance. The obligations shall be direct, unlimited obligations of the Borough, and the Borough shall be obligated to levy *ad valorem* taxes upon all the taxable real property within the Borough for the payment of the obligations and the interest thereon without limitation of rate or amount.

Section 11. Section 2 of the Original Bond Ordinance is hereby amended to replace the term "Local Bond Law" wherever such term appears with the term "Redevelopment Law". Section 6(b) of the Original Bond Ordinance is hereby amended in its entirety to read as set forth in Section 7(b) hereof.

Section 12. This bond ordinance shall take effect 20 days after the first publication thereof after final adoption.
